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SKNFA 2023 GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

PREAMBLE

The SKNFA Leagues are offering a playing environment focused on the highest level of competition to inspire the development of national and international level football players. The Leagues are committed to maintaining excellence in football while instilling the values of sportsmanship and fair play.

The highest level of competition and excellence is maintained by limiting admission to the top echelon of the league. Limited admission provides incentive for players and teams to develop to their highest potential. In addition, maintaining excellence at the top level of the league brings success and notoriety at the national and international level to our teams and players.

Enhanced recognition of our teams results in higher-level tournament acceptance and increased number of college and professional opportunities for our players.

The Rules of the SKNFA Leagues were written for the benefit of the league and its players. While this document is intended to be comprehensive and thorough, it should be understood that not all situations, circumstances, and events can be anticipated and, therefore covered precisely. Further, it is recognized that on occasion conflicting rules or statements may inadvertently occur.

Therefore, it shall be the firm policy of the SKNFA in resolving such conflicts to exercise its authority to override and/or amend these rules in keeping with their intent and purpose. Each person having any responsibility whatsoever for a team either participating in the Leagues or desiring to participate in the Leagues is responsible for reading and knowing these rules.

In the event charges of infraction of these rules are made against a player, parent, team, coach, team manager, and/or team representative, claims by said accused person of ignorance of these rules will not be considered a viable defense to said charges. It is each team's responsibility to see to it that each person having any responsibility for the team receives a copy of these rules and that copies are made available and read by all the team's officials and players.

The SKNFA Leagues operate as active playing leagues within the Federation of St. Kitts-Nevis, and as such, all participants in the Leagues are responsible for knowing and following all the rules of the SKNFA.

Commencement of the 2023 Football Season

The 2023 SKNFA Football Season will commence on **Sunday 5th February, 2023** with the President's Cup.

Rule 1

STRUCTURE & FORMAT OF COMPETITIONS

a) The Association shall organize separate leagues, competitions, matches, and events amongst the registered clubs in the different divisions:

- Competition I – Premier Division regular season and Super Six
- Competition II – Division I regular season – Finals (where applicable)
- Competition III – FA Cup “Knock-out” competition
- Competition IV – Youth Leagues (Boys and Girls)-Finals (where applicable)
- Competition V – Senior Female League-Finals (where applicable)
- Competition VI – 5-A-Side, 7-A-Side Tournament
- Competition VII – Beach Soccer
- Competition VIII – Futsal Tournament
- Competition IX – President's Cup
- Skills Competition and 5-A-Side Street Football
- Any other competitions sanctioned by the SKNFA

b) Each team shall play against each other in a round robin format, with three (3) points for a win, one (1) point for a draw, and zero points for a defeat.

General team rankings and points standings shall be determined by the following criteria:

- Greatest number of points obtained in all matches;
- Goal difference in all group matches;
- Greatest number of goals scored in all group matches; If two (2) or more teams are equal based on the above criteria, their rankings shall be determined as follows:
- Greater number of points scored in matches between tied teams;
- Greater goal difference in matches between tied teams (if more than two teams finish equal on points);
- Greater number of goals scored in matches among the tied teams (if more than two teams finish on equal points);
- The lower number of points based on the number of yellow and red cards in all matches is considered according to the following additions:
 - Yellow Card: +1 point each
 - Direct Red Card: +3 points each
- Toss of a coin

c)

(l) If a team does not report for a match except in cases of **force majeure** recognized by the Competitions Committee of the SKNFA League, the team shall be considered as having lost the match and three points shall be awarded to their opponent, as if it were a match won with

three goals to none.

(II) If the team refuses to continue to play or leaves the ground before the end of a match, the team shall be considered as having lost the match and three points shall be awarded to their opponent, as if it were a match won with three goals to none.

(III) The guilty team in (II) above shall be excluded from further participation in the competitions/league so that none of its matches are deemed valid unless the incidents mentioned occurred at its last match. In addition, the guilty team/club shall pay compensation for any damages or losses incurred by the other team/club and the SKNFA.

Furthermore, the guilty team/club may be disqualified from taking part in the next SKNFA league/competition, or any activity organized under the auspices of the SKNFA.

(IV) If a player or official of any team shall be deemed to have brought the game into disrepute, the player or official of that team shall be brought before the disciplinary committee of the SKNFA.

d) The Competitions & Tournaments Committee for the SKNFA League shall take whatever action is deemed necessary in cases of **force majeure**.

e) The General Secretary shall give a minimum of forty-eight (48) hours' notice in writing of all **fixture and rescheduled matches**.

f) To have a match rescheduled, clubs/teams shall submit a written request to the General Secretary seventy-two (72) hours before the original match date.

g) All competitions shall be gender exclusive unless otherwise directed by the Competition Director and sanctioned by the Management of the SKNFA.

SKNFA COMPETITIONS DIRECTOR

- a) Responsible for the general administration and management of all competitions staged by SKNFA.
- b) Supervision of all competitions staff and volunteers including but not limited to General Coordinators, Assistant General Coordinators, Match Commissioners, Security Officers et al.
- c) Prepare job-related reports as directed including for SKNFA Executive Body, Competitions Committee Meetings, Technical Committee and SKNFA Annual General Meetings.
- d) Develop competitions regulations for review on recommendation by Competitions Committee and Technical Committee.
- e) Determining kick-off times.
- f) Develop and propose competition structures and formats for review and recommendation by Technical Committee and Competitions Committee.
- g) Responsible for the appointments for general coordinators, assistant general

coordinators, match commissioners to various matches for all competitions organized by or for SKNFA.

- h) Act as a primary reference for member Clubs enquiries on competition matters.
- i) Serve as the manager for records & disciplinary matters, manager for competition inventory and manager for competitions welfare.
- j) Arranging and recommending the venues and dates of the matches whenever matches must be rescheduled and Coordinate logistics for tournaments.
- k) Conduct stadium, and other competitions related venues inspections.
- l) Supervising general preparations, deciding on the match system, the draws and forming groups.
- m) Supervise the General Coordinator for SKNFA tournaments.
- n) After consultation with the Competition Committee, fixing the dates, venues and fields for the matches.
- o) Liaise with head of SKNFA Referees Committee on appointments and coordinate distribution of equipment.
- p) Manage disciplinary administration at tournaments/competitions.
- q) Assist with VIP Protocol at tournaments.
- r) Prepare post tournament reports.

SKNFA COMPETITION COMMITTEE and OTHER COMMITTEES

The Competition Committee for the SKNFA Leagues and Competitions is appointed by the SKNFA Executive Committee is responsible for the supervision of leagues, tournaments, and competitions.

l)The Competition Committee shall, amongst other matters, be responsible for:

- a) Dealing with all reported issues from the Competitions Director
- b) Dealing with protests and reports from Clubs
- c) Dealing with breaches of the doping regulations;
- d) Deciding which laboratories will carry out the doping analyses;
- e) Settling cases of force majeure.
- f) Deciding which matches will be subjected to doping tests.

g) Report all discipline matters to the General Secretary

II. The Competition Committee's decisions shall be final.

III. DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

The SKNFA Disciplinary Committee is empowered to:

- i. Admonish, sanction, fine, suspend or disqualify players, referees, Team officials or coaches.
- ii. Take any disciplinary measure in accordance with the SKNFA and FIFA Disciplinary Code against any person or Club(s) which may violate the Competition Regulations, the Laws of the Game or the rules of Fair Play.
- iii. Match Coordinator, Report serious matters for further consideration by the Executive Committee.
- iv. The decisions of the Disciplinary Committee must be based on written reports from referees, the Match Commissioner and General Coordinators and video footage of the disputed match. All Clubs must be informed of the sanctions imposed.
- v. The Disciplinary Committee may convene a personal hearing and shall decide the procedure to be followed. Decisions resulting from such hearing shall be invalid if less than three members are present.
- vi. Any other offenses that may be committed during the SKNFA League and Competitions by Team officers, technicians or other personnel shall be punished by the appropriate Club under the provisions of its own Regulations for Championships and Competitions. For this purpose, the Executive Committee shall refer to the Club the referee's report of the match in question. The Club shall, in turn, report back to the Executive Committee on the resolution of the matter and any disciplinary action taken.
- vii. If the referee must suspend a match due to intervention from spectators, sporting authorities or local police, or due to aggression against any game official or member of the any team, if found to be responsible by the Disciplinary Committee, the guilty team shall forfeit the match with a score of 5 goals to 0 or the score prevailing when the match is suspended, whichever provides the greater margin of victory.
- viii. Furthermore, if found to be responsible by the Disciplinary Committee, the facilities in which the interrupted match is held shall be suspended for the remaining games of the League or Competition.
- ix. If a game is suspended due to withdrawal, the team(s) refusing to complete the match shall be fined a sum not exceeding EC\$5,000.00 and all players on the field of play shall be suspended for a maximum of 5 games.

- x. Any other infringement of these Regulations, by players, referees, officials, coaches or officers, subject to economic sanctions, shall be reported to the General Secretariat for consideration by the Executive Committee.
- xi. All economic penalties assessed must be paid no later than sixty (60) days after notification thereof by the corresponding Club. Unless otherwise specified, the total amount of all fines will accrue to SKNFA.
- xii. The SKNFA Disciplinary Committee decisions may be based on written, audio/visual records and/ or oral hearings. When deciding, the SKNFA Disciplinary Committee may refer to reports made by the Referee, Assistant Referees, Fourth Official, Referee Assessor, Match Commissioner, Match Coordinator, and Security Officer(s).
- xiii. Such reports may be used as evidence but only so far as disciplinary aspects of the case being dealt with are concerned and shall not affect a referee's decision regarding facts connected with play.

APPEAL COMMITTEE

- A. The Appeal Committee shall hear appeals lodged against decisions passed by the Disciplinary Committee, which are not final according to these regulations.
- B. The procedure to be applied by the Appeal Committee is defined in the Regulations governing the SKNFA Appeal Committee's function.
- C. The Appeal Committee shall reach its decisions based on the documents and other means of evidence contained in the Disciplinary Committee's file. However, the Appeal Committee may, if necessary, also resort to any further evidence (including television and video recordings, etc.), which considers relevant.
- D. Decisions pronounced by the Appeal Committee are final.

Rule 2

SUBSCRIPTIONS

Each club shall be required to pay an annual subscription fee of \$100.00 on or before the 31st March, of each year.

Rule 3

REGISTRATION/PARTICIPATION FEES & PROCESS

Each club may enter one or more teams into the League Competitions organized by the Association provided that the Clubs pay the subscription fee, participation fee for each team entering the competition. Teams representing or subordinate to the same club are not allowed to participate in the same division.

1. Registration Process

All Clubs must complete registrations of their teams' players using FIFA Connect Platform. The following information is to be provided:

1. First and last names of players
2. Gender
3. Address
4. Date of Birth
5. Player's Photo
6. Player's I.D
7. Parent's Consent Form

I. Clubs are to register all teams to participate in various leagues at the beginning of the season.

II. It is allowed for a player who was not previously registered with any club for two (2) years and more to be registered without obtaining a transfer.

III. A player who was not registered at the start of 2023 and was previously registered with another club within a period less than two years must seek a transfer from their previous club.

IV. All Clubs may register up to the maximum number of players below to participate in the following Leagues:

- Premier Division – 30 players
- Division 1 – 30 players
- Women's League – 30 players
- Males Youth League – 25 players
- Females Youth Leagues – 25 players

2. Registration Fees

I. Each participating team shall pay a participation fee as per division:

- a. Premier Division – EC \$900.00
- b. Division 1 - EC \$500.00
- c. Youth and Female Leagues – EC \$200.00

II. Each player and technical staff member of each team must have an Identification Card (ID) to play and participate in all SKNFA Leagues/Competitions.

III. The first ID Card will be issued at no cost. However, \$50.00 will be charged for every other issued ID card.

3. Insurance

- I. All players participating in the SKNFA Football Leagues are required to have insurance.
- II. No player will be allowed to play in any leagues or competitions if he or she has not completed the insurance form and become duly insured.

- III. Any team playing an uninsured player/s shall forfeit the match or matches concerned and 3 points awarded to the opponent/s as if it were a match won with 3 goals to none. The club may be summoned to the Disciplinary Committee where further sanction may be imposed.
- IV. Kindly refer to insurance policy for further details.

4. Transfer Window

- I. The transfer window for the SKNFA National Football League is as follows:
 - Period 1: Opened on October 24th 2022 and closes on the Friday 20th January, 2022 at 11:59pm
 - Period 2: Opens from 17th April 2023 to 28th April 2023 at 11.59 p.m.
- II. Club seeking transfer players from one Club/Team to another Club/Team must submit a Transfer Request using the FIFA Connect Registration Platform and pay an administrative fee of EC \$75.00 to the FA Secretariat in the first transfer window.
- III. In the second transfer window, Clubs are to submit a Transfer Request using FIFA Connect Platform and pay \$75.00 to the SKNFA.
- IV. Clubs seeking to transfer coaches and team officials from one Club/Team to another Club/Team must submit a Request using the FIFA Connect Registration Platform and pay an administrative fee of EC \$100.00 to the FA Secretariat.

Rule 4.

TROPHIES AND AWARDS

The Association shall be responsible for providing cups/trophies to be competed for annually. Cups/Trophies and Awards to be competed for are as follows: -
All Leagues - Winner - Trophy and 30 Medals
- 2nd Place - 30 Medals
- 3rd Place - 30 Medals

Special & Individual Awards

- I. At the end of the regular season each club shall nominate persons for the below individual awards.
Individual awards shall be decided on a points system as mentioned on the SKNFA Awards Form.
- II. The Special and Individual Awards shall be decided from the following lists:
 - a. League MVP
 - b. Golden Boot
 - c. Best Defender
 - d. Best Midfielder
 - e. Golden Glove
 - f. Coach of the Year
 - g. Referee of the Year
 - h. Club Community Service Award

CLUBS

- a. A club may register one or more teams for participation in the league competitions organized by the Association. No club is allowed to have more than one (1) team in the same division.
- b. All clubs must adopt a primary school and commit to at least one (1) social activity. The adoption of the school and the community social activity must be completed within the first three (3) months of the 2023 season.

Rule 6.

TEAMS

- a. Only teams whose clubs are affiliated to the Association shall participate in the League competitions.
- b. All Clubs' teams gaining admittance to the league competition shall be registered in the Junior League except otherwise decided by the FA at a meeting of the SKNFA.
- c. All teams MUST submit a COMPLETED Club Information Form inclusive of all officials and contacts of the club.
- d. Every playing member of a team must be registered with the Association.
- e. Each team is allowed SIX (6) substitutions during a match. One of the 6 substitutions allowed must be a goalkeeper. Additionally, the names of players, reserves and team officials must be submitted to the Referee before the start of play.
- b) A maximum of nine (9) reserves players and a maximum of seven (7) team officials shall be allowed on the bench whilst the game is in progress. The referee may at any time for due reason, request any player or team official to leave the vicinity of the field of play and the technical area.
- c) The seven officials on the bench of the team's technical staff shall include the following:
 - Head Coach (CONCACAF C or Higher) – Mandatory
 - Assistant Coach (CONCACAF C License) – Mandatory
 - Goalkeeper Coach (FIFA, CONCACAF or SKNFA Certification)
 - Medical Personnel (Accredited Organization Qualified) – Mandatory
 - Team Manager
 - Trainer (Certified)
 - Physiotherapist (Certified)
 - Equipment Manager
 - Assistant Team Manager
- d) The SKNFA will provide the necessary training for Clubs' technical staff members to be certified. All Clubs' must have certified technical staff members. (No technical staff member who is not certified will be allowed in teams' technical area).

- e) Teams' Technical Staff members should be appropriately dressed in the same uniform (shirts and pants of the same color and style). Appropriately dressed means staff members can wear a football uniform (jersey, short pants, and same color socks); also, a long track pants and polo shirt of the same color are acceptable. The Head Coach is allowed to wear distinct colors different to other technical staff members. No jeans or draggers (open shoes) are allowed to be worn while on the bench by technical staff members. All shoes must be closed shoes including sneakers. Technical Staff members who are inappropriately dressed will not be allowed on the bench by Match Coordinator and/or Match Commissioner.
- f) During a match only the team's qualified head coach, qualified assistant coach or qualified goalkeeper coach can stand and give technical information to the players on the field. Only one person is allowed to stand at any one time in the technical area.
- g) Team Colors: Each team shall register two or more different contrasting playing uniforms for outfield players and goalkeepers. The SKNFA reserves the right to assign the playing uniform that each team will wear for every match of the competitions based on the approved match kits.
- h) The team listed first on the fixture is designated the Home Team while the other listed second is designated the Away Team.
- i) Any team playing an unregistered player or one who is not properly transferred and has included that player on the match list shall forfeit the match or matches concerned and 3 points awarded to the opponents as if it were a match won with 3 goals to none.
- j) Any team playing a player or has a player in the technical area who is under suspension shall forfeit that match or matches concerned and the 3 points awarded to the opponents, as if it were a match won with 3 goals to none.
- k) A team who has more than three players representing St. Kitts-Nevis National Teams on international duties may request to have its matches rescheduled. Teams that have three or less players representing the National Team are expected to play its scheduled matches as per fixture.
- l) All teams must register a head coach and an assistant coach. The coaches must have the Concacaf C License or a higher qualification for the 2021 League. A copy of the coach's qualification must be presented with the registration form.
- m) A team that has Coaches on the bench who do not have the Concacaf C License or higher shall forfeit the match or matches concerned and 3 points awarded to the opponents as if it were a match won with 3 goals to none.
- n) Where dressing rooms are provided, all teams shall return to their respective dressing rooms twenty (20) minutes before the scheduled kick-off time for inspection. The team manager is responsible for ensuring that this deadline is observed. Failure of the team to observe this deadline would lead to the matter being referred to the Disciplinary Committee.

- o) The SKNFA may enter National Youth Teams in the Youth and Senior Leagues. Players who are representing the National Youth Teams will be allowed to play in the premier division or division one once the player is eligible (meet the age criteria). However, such must be given written permission to participate.

Rule 7.

PLAYERS/COACHES/OFFICIALS

1. PLAYERS

- a) All players must be registered members of teams and shall be given a registration number by the Association.
- b) All players (male and female) who are registering with the SKNFA for the first time must complete a “First Registration Form” (Form to be collected from the SKNFA Secretariat).
- c) A first-time player who has not completed this will be considered not registered. Hence, his or her team shall lose the points.
- d) For a player to move from one club to another a Transfer Request must be submitted using the FIFA Connect Platform by the club requesting the transfer.
- e) A player may transfer from one club to another only during the transfer and registration periods as designated by the SKNFA.
- f) Transfers and Registrations of players are only permitted during the designated registration and transfer periods.
- g) Any player seeking transfer is not allowed to play in any match until the transfer process has been completed i.e., approved, or denied transfer certificate.
- h) All players participating in the SKNFA Leagues are eligible for National Team Representation. National Players must be a citizen of St. Kitts-Nevis. Once players are selected to represent the country; players must attend National Team training.
- i) Players selected to represent St. Kitts and Nevis are not allowed to participate in any other league that is NOT approved or sanctioned by the SKNFA. Players must receive a written approval from the SKNFA to participate in Leagues not approved or sanctioned by the SKNFA. Players selected to represent St. Kitts and Nevis who does not receive the approval to play in Leagues and/or Tournaments not approved or sanctioned by the SKNFA will be suspended from the SKNFA Leagues participation and will be reported to the Disciplinary Committee for further disciplinary actions.
- j) Any player who has been refused a transfer by any club may appeal to the Players Status Committee to have the matter resolved.
- k) A registered club player can only play for one team and in one division (except National Teams selected players). Club registered players shall not be allowed to play in different

divisions. Club Teams that play players who are already playing in another division shall be fined and reported to the Disciplinary Committee for further disciplinary actions.

2. COACHES

- a) All coaches must be registered members of teams and shall be registered in the FIFA Connect Registration System.
- b) A coach may move from one club to another at any time using the FIFA Connect Registration System.
- c) Registration of coaches who were not registered with the Association at the beginning of the season must be registered in the FIFA Connect System.
- d) Any coach moving from one club to another is not allowed to coach in match until the registration process in the FIFA Connect System has been completed.
- e) All Coaches shall dress in proper coaching attire for all matches.
- f) All coaches must have the minimum CONCACAF C License and must attend the SKNFA annual Coaching Refreshers Course to be scheduled by the Association.
- g) In changing coaches, and with the approval of the SKNFA, clubs are allowed a maximum of four (4) weeks to have qualified coaches in position.
- h) Teams who fail to use qualified coaches at their matches, except for the four (4) weeks allowed and approval given by the SKNFA, shall forfeit the match or matches concerned and 3 points awarded to the opponents as if it were a match won with a score of 3 goals to none.

3. TEAM OFFICIALS

- a. All Team Officials must be registered members of teams and shall be given a registration number by the Association.
- b. All teams must register the following Team officials:
 - Team Manager
 - Trainer and/or physiotherapist
- c. For a Team Official to move from club to another a request must be submitted using the FIFA Connect Platform by the club requesting the official.
- d. A Team Official may move from one club to another at any time once the process is completed.

- e. Registration of Team Officials who were not registered with the Association at the beginning of the season must be lodged with the Secretariat on the appropriate forms, at least 48 hours before participating in the match.
- f. Any Team Official seeking to move from one team to another is not allowed to administer in matches until the process has been completed.
- g. All Team Officials must attend the SKNFA annual Club Development Seminar to be scheduled by the Association.

Rule 8.

REFEREES AND ASSISTANT REFEREES AND OTHER MATCH OFFICIALS

- a) After each match, the referees shall complete a Report on the match, and forward it to the Secretary of the Association, within twenty-four (24) hours after the conclusion of the match. The Report shall contain as much detail as possible about all occurrences before during and after the match, such as: -
 - (i) Detailed result.
 - (ii) Misconduct of players leading to caution or expulsion.
 - (iii) Unsporting behavior of players, officials, and supporters.
 - (iv) Any other incidents.
- b) The SKNFA reserve the right to appoint a Match Commissioner and/or Match Coordinator for All SKNFA matches. The Match Commissioner or Coordinator shall complete a report and forward it to the Secretary of the Association, within twenty-four (24) hours after the conclusion of the match.
- c) Where applicable, all matches shall have a Referee Assessor. The Referee Assessor shall complete a report and forward it to the Secretary of the Association, within twenty-four (24) hours after the conclusion of the match.
- d) The referees, assistant referees, fourth officials, match coordinator, match commissioner, and referee assessor if required to do so, shall attend any meeting held by the Disciplinary Committee, only to assist the Committee with any point of his report that is not understood.
- e) The referees, assistant referees, fourth officials and Referee Assessor shall be evaluated on a continual basis by the Referees Committee and/or Referee Department.

Rule 9.

LAWS OF THE GAME

The matches shall be played in conformity with the laws of the game promulgated by Federation International de Football Association, (F.I.F.A.).

Rule 10.

GENERAL

- a. Players and Officials may be required for media interviews before or after games.

Failure to cooperate may be deemed to be a breach of these rules and regulations.

- b. A player who receives two yellow cards in a match shall be automatically suspended for the next match in the same competition of which his team is fixtured to play.
- c. A player who receives a direct red card in a match shall automatically be suspended for the next two matches in which his/her team is fixtured to play.
- d. A player who receives a second direct red card, in all competitions, shall automatically be suspended for the next three matches in which his/her team is fixtured to play and be reported to the Disciplinary Committee.
- e. A player who receives a third direct red card, in all competitions, shall automatically be suspended for the next four matches in which his/her team is fixture to play and reported to Disciplinary Committee who may impose further sanctions.
- f. A player who receives a fourth direct red card, in all competitions, shall automatically be suspended for the next five matches in which his/her team is fixture to play and reported to Disciplinary Committee who may impose further sanctions.
- g. A player receiving a red card in the team's final match of a season shall be suspended for their first match in the next season. Further sanctions, if any, imposed by the Disciplinary Committee shall (continue to be) served in the next season.
- h. A player or team official who accumulates three (3) yellow cards, in the same competition, shall automatically be suspended for his/her team's next match of the same competition.
- i. A player or team official who accumulates six (6) yellow cards, in the same competition, shall automatically be suspended for his/her team's next two matches of the same competition.
- j. A player or team official who accumulates nine (9) yellow cards, in the same competition, shall automatically be suspended for his/her team's next three matches of the same competition.
- k. Pursuant to (g) (h) and (i) above, following the player's suspension, the yellow cards shall be included in the calculation of yellow cards for further suspensions.
- l. At the end of the regular season, calculation of yellow card accumulation during the regulation season (excluding the Super 6) shall cease, provided that a player who accumulates 3, 6 or 9 yellow cards shall serve the suspension pursuant (g) (h) and (i) above.
- m. A player who accumulates three (3) yellow cards in the Playoffs stage of the competition shall automatically be suspended for his or her team's next match.
- n. Upon receiving a report from a referee that he or she has cautioned a player (i.e., a yellow card) for violation of the laws of the game, the General Secretary shall send an acknowledgement to the referee and send to the secretary of the club for which the

player was playing at the time written notification that the caution has been administered and recorded.

- o. Upon receiving a report from a referee that he or she has dismissed a player from the field of play for misconduct the General Secretary shall send an acknowledgement to the referee and send to the secretary of the player's club a letter informing of the player's automatic one game suspension and any further disciplinary action.
- p. Upon receiving the said notification reference above, the club secretary must convey the notification to the player concerned. It is the duty of the club secretary and the player to acknowledge receipt of the notification within seven (7) days of the date stated on it.
- q. Any team official expelled from the bench during a match, the said official may be, if necessary, escorted from the stadium for the game to resume. If the guilty official refuses to leave the stadium, the said official shall be suspended from taking part in any other match and reported to the Disciplinary Committee.
- r. A team official who receives a direct red card shall be automatically suspended for that team's next two matches. The said official may be summoned by the Disciplinary Committee for further sanctioning.
- s. A team official who receives a second direct red card on the bench for the second time shall be automatically suspended for that team's next five consecutive matches. The said official shall be summoned to the Disciplinary Committee for further sanctioning.
- t. Team official serving suspension must not take any part (coaching, advising) in the team's matches. Team officials guilty of this act shall be referred to the Disciplinary Committee for further suspension.
- u. Any player or team/club official who is found guilty of physical assaults on a match official shall be fined a minimum of EC\$1000.00 and be suspended for a minimum of nine (9) consecutive matches. Also, the said individual may be summoned by the disciplinary committee, which can impose further sanctions.
- v. Any player or team/club official who is found guilty of using threatening language towards a match official shall be fined a minimum of EC\$1,000.00 and be suspended for a minimum of five (5) consecutive matches. Also, the said individual may be summoned by the disciplinary committee, which can impose further sanctions.
- w. Any player or team/club official who is found guilty of verbal abuse to a match official shall be suspended for a minimum of 3 consecutive matches. Also, the said individual may be summoned by the disciplinary committee, which can impose further sanctions.
- x. Any player or team/club official who is found guilty of physical assaults on another player shall be suspended for a minimum of five (5) consecutive matches. Also, the said individual may be summoned by the disciplinary committee, which can impose further sanctions.
- y. Once the referee reports an act of misconduct by a player or team official, pursuant to

sections (S), (T), (U) and (V) above, the Secretariat shall write to the club informing them of the charge against the player. The player shall have forty-eight (48) hours in which to respond to the said charge if the player/match official accepts the charge, or fails to respond to the charge within forty-eight (48) hour window then the applicable sanctions shall be automatically enforced. If the player or team official denies the charge within forty-eight (48) hours, the matter shall go to the Disciplinary Committee for a hearing.

- z. Players and team officials guilty of involvement in a brawl shall be sanctioned with a suspension for at least 9 matches.
- aa. If, in the case of violence, it is not possible to identify the perpetrator(s), the SKNFA shall sanction the club to which the aggressors belong.
- ab. Disciplinary measures shall be imposed on clubs where a team fails to conduct itself properly. In particular: a six (6) point deduction shall be imposed where the players are guilty of involvement in a brawl.
- ac. Players warming up around their benches must wear a color which is different to that of their team participating on the field. Players must be properly dressed when on the pitch during game time.
- ad. All clubs and affiliated Associations shall play or administer football in conformity with these rules. Infringement of these rules shall be subject to Disciplinary Committee sanctions.
- ae. All participants shall always act in the best interest of the game and shall not act in any manner which is improper or brings the game into disrepute.

Rule 11.

NO SHOW FOR FIXTURED MATCH

- a. Any team that fails to show up for a fixtured match without prior notice and reasonable cause as determined by the Competitions Committee shall lose the match by default. In addition, the defaulting team shall incur a fine of EC \$300.00 such amount to be paid to the office of the Football Association forty-eight (48) hours after the match has been completed or before the team plays its next fixtured match. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in an automatic forfeiture of the up-coming match or matches and further sanctioning.
- b. Any team missing three (3) matches, without reasonable cause shall be removed from the competition fixture, and shall not be allowed to take any further part in the said competition.
- c. "Reasonable cause" shall be defined to mean acts of God, accidents, or failure of requisite equipment which makes its impractical or impossible for the team to show up

for the match.

- d. In such an event, the team should file a “Request for Re-fixturing” stating clearly the basis for its request. The request shall be examined by the Leagues Competition Committee, which shall render a final judgment on the matter.

Rule 12.

FIXTURES

At the start of each football season, The Association will issue a set of fixtures for each division.

Accordingly, member clubs should design their foreign and local engagements around the said fixtures.

Rule 13.

START TIME FOR EACH MATCH

The Fixtures issued by The Association will indicate the start time for each match. Each Referee assigned to a match shall take every reasonable step to start a match on time, but if unable to do so, shall advise each team manager of the new start time before the expiry of the original start time but no later than ten (10) minutes thereafter. A Referee can allow up to fifteen (15) minutes past the greater of the assigned start time or the revised start time to commence a match. Therefore, he should take the required steps to call the match. Notwithstanding the above period, in the case of unforeseen circumstances, the referee in his or her own deliberative discretion shall set the start time of the match.

Participating teams must be assembled and ready for inspection in their respective dressing rooms twenty (20) minutes before game time.

Any team, which fails to have the requisite numbers (seven (7) players) required to play a match, will lose the said match by default.

Rule 14.

MATCH LOST BY DEFAULT or ABANDONMENT

a) A team that loses a match by default shall not be awarded points or goals while the opposing team shall be awarded three points as if it were a match won with three (3) goals. The losing team shall incur a fine of minimum EC \$300.00 and reported to the Disciplinary Committee for further action.

b) A team that loses a match by abandonment shall not be awarded points or goals while the opposing team shall be awarded three points as if it were a match won with a minimum of three (3) goals. The losing team shall incur a fine not exceeding EC \$5000.00 and reported to the Disciplinary Committee for further action.

c) In the case of a match being abandoned because of force majeure after it has already kicked off, the following principles will apply:

- The match shall recommence at the same minute at which play was interrupted rather than being replayed in full and with the same score line
- The match shall recommence with the same players on the pitch and substitutes available as when the match was abandoned
- No additional substitutes may be added to the list of players on the team sheet
- The team can make only the number of substitutions to which they were still entitled when the match was abandoned
- Players sent off during the abandoned match cannot be replaced
- Any sanctions imposed before the match was abandoned remain valid for the remainder of the match
- The match shall restart at the play where the play was stopped when the match was abandoned (i.e., with a free kick, throw-in, goal kick, corner kick, penalty kick, etc.) If the match was abandoned while the ball was still in play, it shall restart with a dropped ball from the position of the ball when play was stopped.
- The kick-off time, date and location shall be decided by the SKNFA.
- Any matters requiring a further decision shall be handled by the SKNFA.

Rule 15.

ACTS PREJUDICIAL TO THE INTEREST OF THE GAME

A team/player that engages in any of the following acts shall be, prima facie, deemed to have committed acts prejudicial to the interest of the game and shall be summoned to appear before

the Disciplinary Committee where automatic, appropriate and or additional sanctions may be issued.

- appearing for a match and failing to take the field of play
- failing to complete a match when instructed to do so by the Referee
- using abusive language or causing physical injury to match officials
- failing to submit match cards to match officials
- Repeated acts of defiance or un-cooperation with respect to the conduct of matches.
- A player who impersonate or knowingly participates in a match under another person's name

Rule 16.

DISPUTES, PROTESTS and APPEALS

Where clubs intend to lodge a protest over incident(s)/circumstance(s) that occur before or during the game, the following procedure must be followed to lodge protests or appeals:

- a. ALL protests MUST be lodged in writing with the secretariat of the SKNFA within forty-eight (48) hours of the end of the match.
- b. Any club can lodge any protest, appeal for any dispute, incident, circumstance that occur before and during the game.

Appeals of any decision of the SKNFA Disciplinary Committee must be submitted within forty-eight hours and shall be accompanied by a cash payment of five hundred dollars (\$500.00).

Lodging an appeal does not defer a decision taken.

PROTESTS

- a. Protests subject to the following provisions are objections of any kind connected with matches organized in the SKNFA Leagues and Competitions.
- b. Protests shall be submitted, except if the following provisions stipulate a different procedure, in writing to the Match Commissioner not later than two hours after the game and followed up immediately with a written report, including the original protest, to be sent to the SKNFA General Secretariat by fax or hand delivered. In the league or competition, the plaintiff Team will confirm the protest by letter to be sent to the SKNFA General Secretariat within forty-eight hours.
- c. Protests against the eligibility of players taking part in any league matches shall be submitted in writing to the Match Commissioner/Referee not later than two hours after the match in question and confirmed by letter to be sent to the SKNFA General Secretariat within forty-eight hours.
- d. Protests against any incidents that occur during a match shall be directed to the referee by the team captain immediately after the disputed incident and before play has been resumed. The protest shall be confirmed in writing to the Match Commissioner or the SKNFA representative at the match by the head of the team delegation not later than two hours after the match in question.
- e. Protest against the state of the pitch, the markings, the accessory equipment (goals, etc.) or the football shall be made to the referee before the start of the match.
- f. No protests may be made against the referee's decisions on points of fact connected with play, such decisions being final.
- g. Once the winning teams of the SKNFA Leagues and Competition Championships have been proclaimed, any protest or complaint about the sports procedure followed during the competition shall be disregarded.
- h. If an unfounded or irresponsible protest is lodged, a fine may be imposed.
- i. No team/club shall take the Management Committee of the FA to a Court of Law. Should any team/club do so, said team/club shall be subjected to suspension and fine up to \$5000.00.
- j. Further the FA shall report the matter to the FIFA General Secretary and Legal Department.

Rule 17.

DOPING CONTROL

- a) Doping is forbidden
- b) The SKNFA will establish its own Doping Commission to deal with all Football Doping Issues in St. Kitts-Nevis.
- c) The SKNFA shall carry out drug testing for the 2023 Football Leagues.
- d) Doping is the use of and/or distribution of a substance or a composition of substances as promulgated by FIFA in The Doping Control Regulations Schedule I.
- e) The SKNFA reserves the right to carry out random doping tests before and during any competition as deemed necessary.
- f) If the SKNFA suspects a coach, referee, and team official of Doping the SKNFA reserves the right to carry out doping tests on suspected person.
- g) Tests may be carried out at any or all the matches in any competition.
- h) All players in clubs/teams, including reserves shall be subject to doping control.
- i) Any player, referee, coach, team officials of club/team which:
 - 1. Refuses to submit to a drug test.
 - 2. Falsifies the result of a test or attempts to do so.
 - 3. Is found guilty of intentionally or unintentionally taking prohibited substances.
 may be suspended for a maximum of six (6) matches from all football activities sanctioned by the SKNFA and referred to the disciplinary committee for further actions. If any player, referee, coach, team official who has served a suspension is found guilty on a second account shall be suspended for nine (9) matches from all football activities sanctioned by the SKNFA and also referred to the disciplinary committee for further actions. A third offense of any player, referee, coach, team official, that person shall be suspended from further participation in the SKNFA leagues and referred to the Disciplinary Committee for deciding the sanction.
- j) Any official who intentionally or unintentionally abets or incites such an infringement to be committed shall be referred to the disciplinary committee.
- k) For infringements of the doping control regulations as stipulated by FIFA in Schedule I of The Doping Control Regulations, the SKNFA is empowered to apply all sanctions contained in the FIFA list of disciplinary measures.

Rule 18

OTHER REGISTRATION, TRANSFERS AND LOANS

- a) The leagues will be played under the FIFA Regulations for the status and transfer of players.
- b) Players may only be registered to play with a National Association during one registration period as laid down by the National Association, with a LIMIT of one transfer of registration per player in the same season in a period of twelve (12) months.

- c) The registration period for the 2023 League shall close on Friday 20th January 2023 at 11:59pm.
- d) The SKNFA can only register players coming from another Association after the receipt of a certificate of transfer of registration from that of the other Association, referred to as The International Registration Transfer Certificate (ITC).
- e) An International Transfer Certificate (ITC) must be received before the close of the SKNFA registration period and transfer window.
- f) Clubs can enter into Loan Agreements with other Clubs. Each Club is allowed to loan a maximum of two players (2) to other clubs and can accept a maximum of two (2) loaned players.
- g) A player will be considered loaned when the Agreement Form is signed by the General Secretaries of both Clubs and the loaned players. A Loan Administration Fee of EC\$200.00 must accompany the Loan Agreement Form.
- h) All Loan Agreement Period terminates at the end of the season. A loaned player is still considered a member of his original Club. The loan agreement is for playing purposes and said players must comply with rules and regulation of the other Club.
- i) Players on loan are not permitted to play against the team which holds their registration/their parent club in any competition.
- j) All Loan Agreements are to be completed by the end of 2nd transfer window i.e., Friday 28th April 2023.

Rule 19

Club Licensing

All Clubs are to adhere to the Club Licensing Regulations as stipulated by the SKNFA. All Clubs that are fully compliant with these regulations will be considered licensed. The Clubs that are not compliant will be debarred from participation in any SKNFA football leagues until these criteria are met.

Rule 20

Communication

- a) The following are the methods of communication the Competitions Committee will use
- b) to inform clubs and players, coaches, referees, and teams' officials:
 - i. Emails and/or website
 - ii. Letters
 - iii. Telephones

- c) Emails and/or website will be the primary source of communication to Clubs. Each club must submit three active email addresses and /or a website address, and physical address when completing registration forms.
- d) The primary means of communication will be through emails and/or website address
- e) All players, coaches, referees, and team officials are to register his/her email address with the SKNFA
- f) Clubs and other persons who need a hard copy of any document can call the Secretariat to get a copy

Rule 21

All players, team officials, coaches, referees, match officials and spectators are to comply with the SKNFA and FIFA CODE OF CONDUCT/ETHICS, and FIFA Fair Play Code.

Rule 22

ANY AFFILIATED PLAYER, CLUB, LEAGUE, OR OFFICIAL WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH ANY OF THE ABOVE RULES, SHALL BE LIABLE TO DISCIPLINARY ACTION BY THE SKNFA.

Rule 23

The SKNFA's Executive Committee, whose decisions shall be final, will resolve matters not provided for in these Rules and Regulations.

Rule 24

THE CONDITIONS FOR THE USE OF ANY SPORTS FACILITY WILL BE SUBJECT TO THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE MINISTRY OF SPORTS. AS SUCH MEMBER CLUBS WILL BE REQUIRED TO ADHERE TO THE SAID TERMS AND CONDITIONS.

PREMIER LEAGUE

1. The 2023 SKNFA PREMIER LEAGUE shall commence on **Friday 10th February, 2023**.
2. The league shall be conducted in conformity with the rules and regulations of FIFA and the SKNFA.
3. The Premier League shall consist of twelve (12) teams namely:
 - a. Bath United FC
 - b. Cayon Rockets FC
 - c. Conaree FC
 - d. Garden Hotspurs FC
 - e. Newtown United FC
 - f. Saddlers United FC
 - g. Sandy Point FC
 - h. Security Forces United FC
 - i. St. Pauls United FC

- j. St. Peters FC
 - k. United Old Road Jets FC
 - l. Village Superstars FC
4. Venue – Matches will be played at venues determined fit by the SKNFA and on days and times as fixtured.
 5. All players in the Premier Division League who are under 16 years of age must signed consent from parent/guardian. Any team that registers a player on its team list under the age of 16 will lose the match by default and will not be awarded points or goals while the opposing team shall be awarded three points as if it were a match won with three (3) goals to nil if consent form wasn't signed by parent/guardian.

Format

The above-mentioned teams shall play two (2) rounds of round robin matches. The top six (6) teams at the end of the two (2) rounds will then enter a group of six (6) called the Super 6. The three (3) bottom teams in the Premier League at the end of the regular season shall be relegated to Division I and the top team of Division I at the end of the season shall be promoted to the Premier League for the 2023-2024 Season. The 9th place team in the Premier Division at the end of the regular season will play in a single match promotion/relegation playoff vs the 2nd place team in Division 1. The winner will compete in 2023-2024 Premier Division and the loser will compete in Division 1.

Incentives:

- The team with the most points for each round will be awarded one thousand dollars (\$1000.00).
- The team with the most points at the end of the two (2) rounds will be awarded ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00).

Match Days

Generally, the match days for the Premier League are as follows (but is not limited to these days):

- a) Fridays
- b) Saturdays
- c) Sundays

The SKNFA reserves the right to schedule or reschedule any game to any day and time of the week.

PRESIDENT'S CUP

The President's Cup will be played at the start of the 2023 SKNFA Football Season. The winners of the Premier League and the FA Cup will compete in the President's Cup. If one team is the winner of both the Premier League and the FA Cup, the match will be played

between the Premier League Champion and the second placed team in the FA Cup.

Format

- The match shall be played within two (2) 45-minute halves (90 minutes).
- In the event of a tie at the end of regulation time 2-15-minute halves will be played. (Golden goal no longer applies).
- In the event of a tie at the end of extra time:
 - Step 1
The best of five kicks from the penalty mark will apply.
 - Step 2
If at the end of the best of five kicks from the penalty mark there is still a tie, sudden death penalty kicks shall be taken by those players who have not taken penalty kicks before.
 - Step 3
If there is still a tie at the end of steps 1 and 2, continue sudden death kicks from the penalty mark until there is a winner.

The winner of the President's Cup will receive \$2,000.00 and a trophy.

PREMIER LEAGUE SUPER SIX PLAYOFF

The top six (6) teams at the end of the two (2) rounds of matches will enter a group of six (6) called the Super 6.

The Super 6 will be a one (1) round of round robin matches. The two (2) teams leading at the end of the Super 6 Playoffs will then play in the best of three (3) finals to determine the Premier

League Champions.

The WINNER OF THE SUPER SIX COMPETITION will be eligible to represent the Federation in international club championships.

Best of Three Finals

- The finals shall be played within two (2) 45-minute halves (90 minutes).
- In the event of a tie at the end of regulation time 2-15-minute halves will be played. (Golden goal no longer applies).
- In the event of a tie at the end of extra time:
 - Step 1
The best of five kicks from the penalty mark will apply.
 - Step 2
If at the end of the best of five kicks from the penalty mark there is still a tie, sudden death penalty kicks shall be taken by those players who have not taken penalty kicks before.
 - Step 3
If there is still a tie at the end of steps 1 and 2, continue sudden death kicks from the penalty mark until there is a winner.

The prize structure for the Premier League is as follows:

2nd Place - \$20,000.00 with medals

3rd Place - \$8,000.00 with medals

4th Place - \$6,000.00

5th Place - \$4,000.00

6th Place - \$3,000.00

11th Place - \$1000.00

12th Place - \$1000.00

DIVISION I

The 2023 SKNFA DIVISION 1 LEAGUE shall commence on **Tuesday 14th February, 2023**.

The 2023 Division I Football League may consist of the following eligible club teams:

- 13) Youth & Experience FC

Venue – Matches will be played at venues determined fit by the SKNFA and on days and times as fixtured.

All players in the Division I League who are younger than 16 years of age must have signed consent from parent/guardian. Any team that registers a player on its team list under the age of 16 will lose the match by default and will not be awarded points or goals while the opposing team shall be awarded three points as if it were a match won with three (3) goals to nil if consent form wasn't signed by parent/guardian.

Format

The above-mentioned teams shall play two (2) rounds of round robin matches.

The top team of Division I at the end of the season will be promoted to the Premier Division for the 2023-2024 Premier League. The 2nd place team in Division 1 will play in a single match promotion/relegation playoff vs the 9th place team in the Premier Division at the

end of the regular season. The winner will compete in 2023-2024 Premier Division and the loser will compete in Division 1.

Match Days

Generally, the match days for the Division I are as follows (but not limited to any other day):

- Tuesdays
- Thursdays

The SKNFA reserves the right to schedule or reschedule any game to any day and time of the week.

The prize structure for the Division I League is as follows:

Winner - \$6,000.00, a trophy and medals

2nd Place - \$3,000.00 and medals

3rd Place - \$2,000.00 and medals

4th Place - \$1,000.00

FA CUP - Knock-Out Competition

All registered teams in the St. Kitts Nevis Football Association's Premier League, Division I and

Women's League qualify for the 2023 F.A Cup (Knock-Out Competition).

The competition shall be played under the following format:

At the end of the registration date for the 2023 Football league, teams are ranked, zoned and fixtured based on the final standings of the 2021 FA Cup. Teams that did not participate in the 2021 FA Cup will be ranked based on their registration date.

The two finalists from the Knock-out Competition in the 2021 season will represent the top team in each Zone and will benefit from a bye if the Zone has an odd number of teams.

Each preliminary match will be based on teams' ranking from the previous year knock-out competition. The match ups will be arranged in the following format – highest ranked teams will play lower ranked teams. A full fixture will be developed and circulated.

All teams shall compete in matches under the following conditions

PRELIMINARY, QUARTER-FINALS & SEMI-FINALS

Each match shall have a winner and only the winner shall advance to the next round.

Each match shall be 90 minutes' regulation time, i.e., 45 min per half with a 15-minute interval.

In the event of a tie at the end of regulation:

- Step 1
The best of five kicks from the penalty mark will apply.
- Step 2
If at the end of the best of five kicks from the penalty mark there is still a tie, sudden death penalty kicks shall be taken by those players who have not taken penalty kicks before.
- Step 3

If there is still a tie at the end of steps 1 and 2, continue sudden death kicks from the penalty mark until there is a winner.

FINALS

- The final match shall be played within two (2) 45-minute halves (90 minutes).
- In the event of a tie at the end of regulation time two (2) 15-minute halves will be played. (Golden goal no longer applies).
- In the event of a tie at the end of extra time:
 - Step 1
The best of five kicks from the penalty mark will apply.
 - Step 2
If at the end of the best of five kicks from the penalty mark there is still a tie, sudden death penalty kicks shall be taken by those players who have not taken penalty kicks before.
 - Step 3
If there is still a tie at the end of steps 1 and 2, continue sudden death kicks from the penalty mark until there is a winner.

The FA – Cup Knock out competition is governed by the SKNFA Rules and Regulations of the 2021 Football Season.

Male FA winners - The Grand prize for the FA Cup Champions \$8,000.00 and a trophy
The Runner up shall receive \$4,000.00

Female FA winners - The Grand prize for the FA Cup Champions \$3,000.00 and a trophy
The Runner up shall receive \$1,000.00

ELVIS STAR BROWNE WOMEN'S LEAGUE

- 1) The 2023 SKNFA ELVIS STAR BROWNE WOMEN'S LEAGUE shall commence in **March 2023**.
- 2) The league shall be conducted in conformity with the rules and regulations of FIFA and the SKNFA.
- 3) The Elvis Star Browne Women's League shall consist of various clubs' teams.

REGISTRATIONS

- All female players are eligible to participate in the SKNFA Elvis Star Browne Women's Senior League.
- Players below the age of 16 must have signed consent from parent/guardian.

Match Days

Generally, the match days for the Elvis Star Browne Women's League are as follows (but

not limited to any other day):

- Thursdays
- Sundays
- The SKNFA reserves the right to schedule or reschedule any game to any day and time of the week

FORMAT

- Matches will be played in the 11 v 11 format.
- Two rounds of round robin matches will be played between the registered teams.
- Each match will be 90 minutes' regular time i.e. 45 minutes per half with a 15-minute interval.

WOMEN'S LEAGUE FINAL FOUR PLAYOFF

The SKNFA reserves the right to format the Women's League Final Four playoffs and best of three finals based on the number of teams participating in the Women's League.

Four (4) teams at the end of the two (2) rounds will enter a group of four (4) called the Final Four.

The two (2) teams leading at the end of the Final Four (4) Playoffs will then play in the finals to determine the Elvis Star Browne Women's League Champion.

Finals

- The final match shall be played within two (2) 45-minute halves (90 minutes).
